He also can, at times, advocate for commercial and industrial consumers. He appears before the Public Service Commission, State of Delaware courts, Federal courts, and Federal administrative and regulatory agencies on behalf of the interests of consumers regarding rates, service, and practices of public utilities.

In his role as the Public Advocate, Drew serves on the executive committee of the National Association of State Utility Consumer Advocates ("NASUCA"), GTI Public Interest Advisory Committee, Board of the Sustainable Energy Utility, a.k.a. Energize Delaware, Renewable Energy Task Force, National Association of Regulated Utility Commissioners ("NARUC") Subcommittee on COVID-19, Critical Consumer Issues Forum ("CCIF") Advisory Committee, and several other organizations.

Before joining the Division of the Public Advocate, he served the public as Kent and Sussex County Coordinator for Congressman Carney. In that role, his major responsibilities included representing the Congressman at meetings and events, and being the liaison with the public on a multitude of issue areas.
