

Requested Rate Increase by Electric and Gas Utilities (Billion \$)














Net Energy Forecast vs. Real Net Energy






Figure 9: Comparison of US data-center energy demand forecasts





Inefficient Transmission and Distribution Spending







Distribution Capital Expenditures 2019 to 2023 (Billion \$)




















Residential Retail Price of Electricity (\$/kWh)








Americans are concerned about rising utility bills.






Nearly 3 in 5 (56%) Americans don't feel like they fully understand what drives utility costs.





Americans feel powerless over rising utility bills.


This feeling of powerlessness holds true across political parties.


